### **New Year Devotional**



Season of Epiphany, Tuesday January 7, 2020: Psalm 72; 1 Kings 10:1-13; Ephesians 3:14-21

In keeping with the liturgical calendar, after the twelve days of Christmas, we arrive at the season of Epiphany. One definition for Epiphany given in the Merriam Dictionary is "An appearance or manifestation especially of

a divine being." This definition is given to this season, which commemorates the visitation of the three Wise Men or Magi from foreign lands to see the Christ Child, God made flesh. Their visit is fulfillment of prophesy that the God of Israel was also the God of Gentiles.

Other definitions offered are "a sudden manifestation or perception of the essential nature or meaning of something...an intuitive grasp of reality through something (such as an event) usually simple and striking...a revealing scene or moment...an illuminating discovery, realization, or disclosure. Putting it in the vernacular, it is an "Ah Ha" moment; or it evokes the eyebrow raising comment, "I never considered that!"

Can we consider as we begin this New Year and new decade that the season of Epiphany, with all its potential for inventiveness and freshness and originality, can occur at any moment of the day? All it requires is a willingness to be open to the inspirational touch of the Holy Spirit of Eternal Epiphany. Oh God, let it be so!
