## Intergenerational Ministers' Support Groups

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to challenge ministers as they attempt to provide vital and innovative ministry. In order to stay connected the PBA Ministers' Council and the Regional office continue to sponsor the Intergenerational Ministers' Support Groups. Here is an outline of the purpose and practice. The groups meet the first Tuesday, Thursday and Friday of the month in order to:

- To connect with peers that will diminish the sense of isolation that comes with pastoral ministry.
- To build relationships with colleagues of diverse theological perspectives, generational traditions or racial and ethnic backgrounds.
- To engage in spiritual practices for personal spiritual growth.
- To support the belief that a physically and spiritually healthy pastor/minister produces healthy congregations.

### ***Covenant of Engagement.***

We will be guided by the Holy Spirit to create a "space" that...

- Embraces the uniqueness of each participant.
- Ensures confidentiality.
- Encourages transparency through accepting non-critical sharing. **ALL IS SACRED.**
- Evokes inspiration as we develop KEENER listening skills, to engage in provocative questioning and poignant prayer.
- Focuses on what will sustain resilience and instill hope.
- Builds AND strengthens, rather than attempt to "fix."

OUR GROUPS are not intended to provide counseling. However, resources for 1:1 counseling will be provided by request.

### Meet the group facilitators:



**Rev. Julia Bruton-Sheppard:** Her first career was as a registered nurse. She found my most rewarding experience in the field of Hospice Home Care. During those 14 years God presented her with many *life-lessons* caring for those at the end of life. In 1989, Rev. Bruton-Sheppard was licensed to preach at Mt. Carmel Baptist Church, under the pastorate of Rev. Dr. Albert F. Campbell and ordained in 1993. Presently, she continues to hold the position of Associate Minister at Mount

Carmel where Rev. Dr. Donald D. is the current pastor. Rev. Bruton-Sheppard is the Program Facilitator for Communication and Leader Development for Philadelphia Baptist Association.

## Christ & Cultural Humility Initiative

The Philadelphia Baptist Association's *Christ & Cultural Humility Program* resumed in September 2021 with six congregations committed to learning how to become continuous learning organizations. The goal of the program is to equip congregations with the skills they need to overcome challenges that

hinder their ministry growth and vitality.


Each congregation is represented by a Learning Team of five to eight individuals who will lead their congregation in an adaptive change process that will help them tackle an issue facing their church. Participating congregations are Bethlehem Baptist Church in Spring House, Grace Baptist Church of Blue Bell, Second Baptist Church of Doylestown, Second Baptist Church of Germantown, Second Baptist Church of Media, and St. Paul's Baptist Church in West Chester.

Last spring, the six church teams learned how to integrate cultural humility tenets with the teachings of Jesus, with a particular focus on the Beatitudes. Together, those principles serve as a foundational basis for the congregation's inspiration to pursue best practices in their inner congregational dynamic and outward ministry witness. Following an in-depth congregational assessment, the teams are now learning to develop an action plan that can help their church improve incrementally in its target area. The Learning Teams will also teach the broader congregation the foundational concepts and skills they have learned in the program, along with how to think adaptively and the importance of emotional intelligence.

The process of adaptive change is such that it can be used as both a problem-solver and opportunity-maker for the congregations seeking to maximize their ministry efforts. Because of demographic and generational shifts in many neighborhoods, churches are acknowledging that they are surrounded by new neighbors, new dynamics, and new opportunities for ministry outside their doors.

The *Christ & Cultural Humility Program* is designed to help our churches become continuous learning organizations that can grow from these new opportunities in a way that reflects God's mission for reaching everyone and inviting them into the household of faith. The program is about congregations becoming the best reflection of the Church that God is calling them to be. The program maximizes a church's strengths while helping it to grow in areas of need. Engaging in the program leads to a more wholistic, vibrant ministry.

## Relief for Haiti

[International Ministries](#) (IM) and [American Baptist Churches USA](#) invite prayers and support for Haiti and the people of Haiti in the wake of the August 14 earthquake, which devastated the southern portion of the Caribbean nation. The quake struck about 150 km west of the capital city, Port-au-Prince. The initial quake was followed by ongoing aftershocks and compounded by heavy rains and flooding from Tropical Storm Grace.

In contrast to the early response to the 2010 earthquake which devastated Port-au-Prince, IM will not immediately be sending volunteer teams or individuals to Haiti. Continuing aftershocks, gang violence, and the COVID-19 pandemic yield a volatile situation in which IM and their partners are not able to deploy and support personnel effectively. According to Director of Short-Term Mission Rev. Sandra Dorsainvil, "We are not in a position to send any teams to Haiti and must honor and respect the expertise of first responders on the ground."

Financial support for the relief efforts for our Haitian brothers and sisters is being provided by One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) through IM, in coordination with our Baptist and ecumenical partners. Donations to One Great Hour of Sharing can be made via your church; make the church check payable to Philadelphia Baptist Association marked "Haiti" on the memo line and mailed to PBA, 8711 Ridge Avenue, Philadelphia, PA 1928.

One hundred percent of donations go to relief efforts; no dollars are retained for administrative costs. To ensure that your church receives credit for your gift, write the church name on your check or, if giving online, in the "comment" box.

[One Great Hour of Sharing](#) is administered by the World Relief Committee of the Board of General Ministries of American Baptist Churches USA. The committee facilitates American Baptist emergency relief, disaster rehabilitation, refugee work and development assistance by establishing policy guidelines and overseeing distribution of the annual One Great Hour of Sharing offering received by churches.

#### Anniversaries


